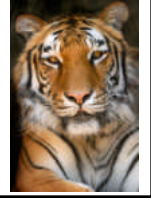

Poster Contest Winners

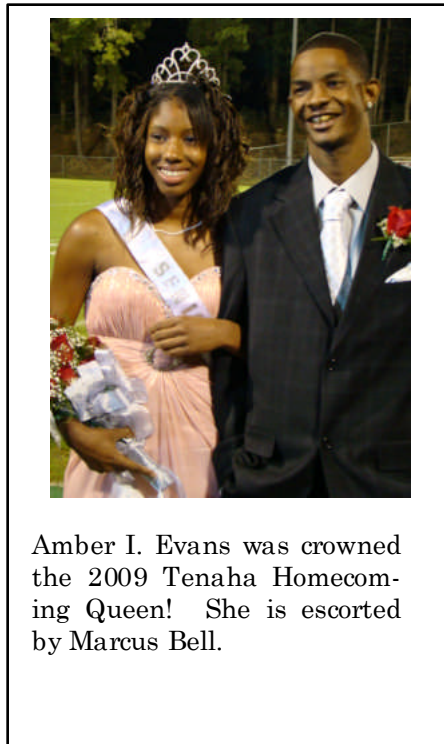

The Tiger Band traveled to SFA to show how good

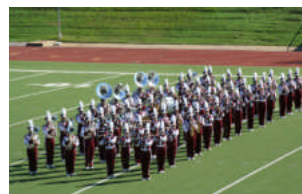
they could march and play their instruments. The Judges were blown away as the Tiger Band played. They gave the band all first division ratings. This means they will
